Background

The 2020 forecast for South Africa's economic growth at -7% would be the worst since democracy, and is likely to come with massive job losses and firms closing down. There are, however, options to mitigate the economic impact of the disease. They include a shift in the macroeconomic approach as well as ramping up new industries, including renewable energy technologies. This Development Dialogue will start with a review of the latest trends in the pandemic and the economy, and then consider at-scale responses to the economic downturn.
